What constitutes ragging?

1. Ragging has several aspects with, among others, psychological, social, political, economic, cultural, and academic dimensions.
2. Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student should be considered within the academics related aspect of ragging; similarly, exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of seniors is also an aspect of academics related ragging.
3. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students should be considered an aspect of ragging for ragging economic dimensions.
4. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestured, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person can be put in the category of ragging with criminal dimensions.
5. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, snail-mails, blogs, public insults should be considered within the psychological aspects of ragging. This aspect would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to others; the absence of preparing 'freshers' in the run up to their admission to higher education and life in hostels also can be ascribed as a psychological aspect of ragging – coping skills in interaction with seniors or strangers can be impacted by parents as well. Any act that affects the mental health and self confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.
6. The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting in Ragging

1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
2. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) will be filed with the local police authorities.
3. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.

(i) Cancellation of admission

(ii) Suspension from attending classes

(iii) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits

(iv) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process

(v) Withholding results

(vi) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.

(vii) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel

(viii) Rustication from the institution in the rarest of the rare cases with the approval of the Gurugram University, Gurugram.

(ix) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.

(x) Fine, depending upon the gravity of the ragging act.

(xi) Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

MECHANISM FOR REDRESSAL OF GRIEVANCES OF STUDENTS

The students are the main stakeholders in any institution imparting education, and it's our endeavour to make all efforts to ensure transparency in all the activities at different stages. Taking this spirit in consideration the Institute has decided to provide mechanism to students for redressal of their grievances as under:

The Grievances may broadly include the following complaints of the aggrieved students

Academic

Non-Academic

Grievance related to Assessment

Grievance related to Victimization

Grievance related to Attendance

Grievance related to charging of fees

Grievance regarding conducting of Examinations

Harassment by colleague students or the teachers etc.

There will be Grievance Redressal Committees at the Department/Institute level to deal with the grievances of the students:

Department/Area Level committee will be as under:

Head of the Department/Area Chairperson - Chairman

Up to 3 (three) faculties to be nominated by the Head of Department/Area Chairperson

This committee will deal with the Grievance related to Academic and Administrative matters of the Department/Area concerned.

Institute Level committee will be as under:

Head of Institute - Chairman

Heads of the Department

Registrar - Member Secretary

This committee will deal with all the Grievances directly which is related to the common problems at Institute level both Academic and Administrative. In addition, this committee will also entertain the appeal filed by the student against the decision of the Department level committee.

Procedure for Redressal of Grievances (RoG)

An aggrieved student who has the Grievance or Grievances at the Department/Area level shall make an application first to the HoD/Area Chairperson. The Head of Department/Area Chairperson, after verifying the facts will try to redress the grievance within a reasonable time, preferably within a week of the receipt of application of the student. If the student is not satisfied with the verdict or solution of the HoD/Area Chair, then the same should be placed before the institute level committee within a week from the date of the receipt of the reply from the Department level committee.

The Institute level committee, if needed, may recommend to the Top management/Higher authorities for necessary corrective action as it may deem fit, to endure avoidance of recurrence of similar grievance at the institute.

While dealing with the complaint the committee at all levels will observe law of natural justice and hear the complainant and concerned people.

The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) committee in the institute shall promote the special interests of students in this category. It is expected to provide special inputs in areas where the students experience difficulties. It will also ensure that no atrocities are committed on the students belonging to SC/ST categories. It will further ensure that the advantage of the welfare schemes of the state and the central govt. is given to these categories in matters of admission, scholarship, stipend and other incentives.

The Committee may conduct regular remedial coaching classes on life skills, personality, development, writing assignments and making presentations. The Committee is also expected to organize interactive sessions and informal meetings with students to attend to their personal, social and academic problems.

Punishments for offence of atrocities, ---

Whoever, not being a member of a Scheduled Castes or a Scheduled Tribes, ---

1. Forces a member of a Scheduled Castes or a Scheduled Tribes to drink or eat any inedible or obnoxious substance;
2. Acts with intent to cause injury, insult or annoyance to any member of a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe.
3. Forcibly removes clothes from the person of a member of a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe or parades him naked or with painted face or body or commits any similar act which is derogatory to human dignity.
4. Intentionally insults or intimidates with intent to humiliate a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe in any place within public view.
5. Assaults or uses forces to any woman belonging to a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe with intent to dishonor or outrage her modesty.

In short, the committee will ensure the total safety and security of these categories and will implement the guidelines of the Ministry of social justice and empowerment.
